I am enormously proud of all we accomplished during the 2022–2023 school year. Daily, we witnessed tangible growth and change as our long-anticipated Gym took physical form.

It was thrilling to watch as we crossed major milestones: the pouring of the concrete slab, erecting the frame, enclosing the structure, laying the floor, all of the finishing work, and—perhaps most exciting—imagining this new space brimming with life and exuberance as we gather, cheer, and celebrate as a community.

The 2022–2023 school year was a time of returning to in-person events and festivals. I am particularly grateful for the work of the Parent Leadership Group and the Parent/Family Organization in bringing back our in-person Fall Bazaar. On behalf of the Trustees Council, I would like to thank you for your continued support of Washington Waldorf School. Serving as the Chair of the Trustees Council these past two years, I have had the opportunity to see the many ways that our dedicated and generous community have helped our school to continue to thrive. I am pleased to report that our school is financially sound and on solid footing.

The 2022–2023 school year began with the excitement of the gym groundbreaking ceremony at our back to school picnic. This event set the tone for a year where we were able to bring back many of our beloved in-person festivals and other community events. After the separations necessitated by the pandemic, it was such a delight to be back together celebrating our students, faculty, and the whole school community. Seeing our community return for our Fall Bazaar was a joy, and the unprecedented number of prospective families who visited our campus was encouraging for the future of our school. Throughout the year, we had the thrill of seeing the long awaited gym take shape and become a reality.

Tuition alone does not cover the cost of an independent school education. Like other schools, Washington Waldorf School relies on the generosity of our community members to help meet annual expenses, including financial assistance for 36% of our families. In 2022–2023 we exceeded the \$7,000,000 Room to Move campaign goal by raising over

\$7,127,000. Over \$1,000,000 of that total was raised in the last year of the campaign, during the 2022–2023 fiscal year. In addition, we achieved success for the One Fund by raising over \$300,000 for operating expenses and financial aid. These financial highlights reflect the health and well-being of our school and community.

The trustees spent much of 2022–2023 actively engaged in shepherding the final stages of the Room to Move campaign and in solidifying our five year strategic plan. The scope and outcomes of the Room to Move campaign will have a profound impact on our school and we thank each and every one of you for your generous support. The strategic plan defines and furthers our mission by promoting changes that will have a pervasive and persistent effect on the school and propel it forward while maintaining its core foundational elements. It gives shape and structure to the ambitious aims of the Washington Waldorf School trustees and the highest aspirations of Washington Waldorf School parents, faculty, and alums.

The Trustees Council is grateful for your steadfast support of the Washington Waldorf School and our shared commitment to inspiring a lifelong love of learning in every student. We hope you'll continue to support all of our school's efforts to continue to make Waldorf education thrive at our school and in the Greater Washington, DC community.

MESSAGE FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER

The 2022–2023 school year was a transformative period for our school administration, characterized by significant changes and exciting projects. As the Business Office, we have a central role of supporting these initiatives and managing transitions throughout the year. This report provides an overview of key developments, projects, and personnel changes that shaped the past academic year. Please note that these numbers reflect an unaudited report. A full audited report and financial statements can be made available upon request.

Key Projects and Initiatives

Financial Aid

Community need necessitated that we increase our financial aid budget by 10%, resulting in an average award of \$14,177 per student receiving aid. This reflects our commitment to continuing to provide access to quality education for all students, regardless of their financial circumstances.

Resumption of Support Programs

In 2022, we brought back essential support programs, including the afternoon program, lunch services, bus transportation from Acorn Hill, and summer camps. These programs have been instrumental in enhancing the educational experience of our students. These initiatives have played a vital role in fostering the holistic development of our school community.

Gym Construction

A highlight of the year has been the remarkable progress made in constructing the John and Mary Brauer Gym. By the end of the 2022–2023 school year, we achieved an impressive 75% construction completion rate. We eagerly anticipate the enhanced learning experiences and cherished memories that the John and Mary Brauer Gym will provide for our students.

Revenue Diversification

In our ongoing effort to support our programs, we pursued alternative revenue sources. The introduction of Money Market Accounts during the past year has generated nearly 50% of our “other” income. This diversification strategy has supported our financial foundation.

Faculty Salary Increase

In July 2022, we were able to increase faculty salaries by 8%.

Challenges and Operational Results

While we celebrate our achievements in many areas, it is essential to acknowledge that some of our support programs faced challenges during this transition year. Factors such as adapting to the post-Covid era, inflationary pressures, increased supply costs, and salary increases contributed to unexpected increases in expenses. It is important to continue a review of existing and potential revenue streams to enable WWS to offer enhanced programs and improve salaries and benefits for faculty.

Due in part to the transitional return of our support programs, and the factors outlined above, Washington Waldorf School's net financials show a loss for 2022-2023, for the first time in many years. We are fortunate to have a small reserve fund that can be drawn on this year, and we actively worked to minimize expenses going into the 2023-2024 school year. These challenges make our fundraising initiatives all the more important. In order to avoid increasing tuition substantially for all families, we need to ensure that we have a successful enrollment season and continue to meet our fundraising goals each year.

The 2022-2023 school year has been marked by notable accomplishments and transitions within our school administration. We remain dedicated to transparency and responsible financial stewardship as we look ahead to the future. We extend heartfelt appreciation to all staff, past and present, for their contributions and dedication. We look forward to the exciting developments that await us in the coming academic year.

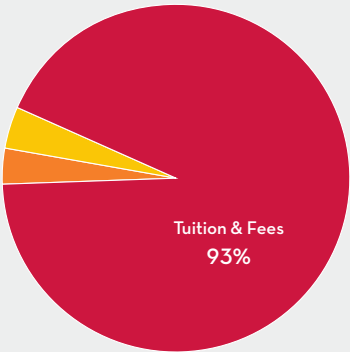

OPERATING REVENUE AND EXPENSES

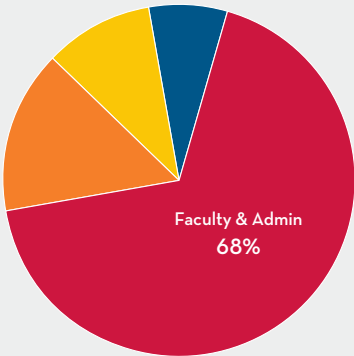

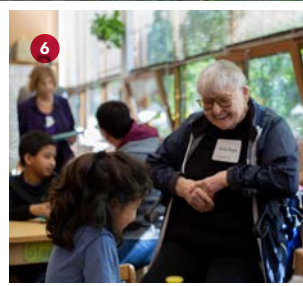
The Parent Leadership Group (PLG) is pleased to have contributed to the return of a full slate of community events during the 2022-23 school year, all with the help of our community. Your involvement in the life of the school supports all of our children and offers the opportunity to form meaningful connections with each other. We are grateful to all who have contributed their time, talent, and treasury.

Entrusted with the Parent/Family Organization budget, the PLG spent funds on some of the initiatives listed below. Highlights of the year include:

- Producing the first in-person **Fall Bazaar** since 2019, with robust attendance and vendor participation. Dedicated help from the WWS community made it happen!
- Supporting ongoing **anti-racism and inclusion** efforts in the community.
- Proposing to the administration the formation of a group of volunteers known as the “Lunch Team” **to discuss constructive changes to the WWS lunch program**, including research into alternative structures. This was followed by submission of a report with suggestions for the future of the lunch program at WWS.
- **Recognizing the dedication of faculty and staff** through the Faculty Appreciation Lunch and other gestures of gratitude throughout the year.
- Providing opportunities for parents and families to connect by helping **produce school-wide events**, hosting **Craft & Conversation sessions**, encouraging class captains to plan **social opportunities for classes**, and hosting **two open meetings** of the P/FO.
- Continued operation of the **WWS Gear Shop**, reselling gently used donated outdoor gear to other WWS families at reduced prices, with proceeds going to the One Fund.

Dear Friends,

The 2022–2023 school year brought significant milestones for Washington Waldorf School. Our collective success is due to the individual efforts and generosity of many in our community, and demonstrative of the leadership of our Trustees Council, Faculty, and Parent/Family Organization. Current parents, alums, parents of alums, grandparents, faculty and staff, and friends of the Washington Waldorf School came together in support of our mission, and achieved long-term goals that we can all be proud of celebrating today. The following are a few highlights and celebrations of the year, from a development and fundraising perspective:

- We began the year by kicking off the public phase of the Room to Move capital campaign to build the John and Mary Brauer gymnasium on our school’s campus. We had a goal to raise the final \$1,000,000 of the \$7,000,000 goal. By the end of June 2023, we had raised an impressive \$7,127,000 from 403 donors, exceeding our goal by 1.8%.
- In addition to the Room to Move campaign, we raised \$325,000 for the One Fund, helping to bridge the gap between tuition and operating expenses.
- The Development Committee led an impressive effort to conduct a dual-ask strategy for both the Room to Move campaign and the One Fund, inviting current parents to support both initiatives. In May 2023, the committee launched a participation campaign, “Be Counted: Add Your Name,” thus doubling our current parent participation. By the end of the year, 75% of parents and 80% of faculty and staff gave to the Washington Waldorf School.

- Maria Monteverde-Jackson and Aglaia Benni co-hosted the “Views of Splendor” Gala at Top of the Town in Arlington, Virginia. This beautiful event raised \$95,000 for the One Fund, to support financial aid at our school.

We are tremendously grateful to all of our donors and volunteers, who made the 2022–2023 school year so successful. Your generosity supports every student, teacher, program, and every grade, every day. Our One Fund and event fundraising provided \$1,300 of additional educational value per student, and accounted for 5% of our school’s operating budget. Because you gave your time and valuable resources, we were able to build upon the sturdy foundation created by those who came before us. I can’t wait to see what we build together next, not only for our current community of students, but for those who will come after us.

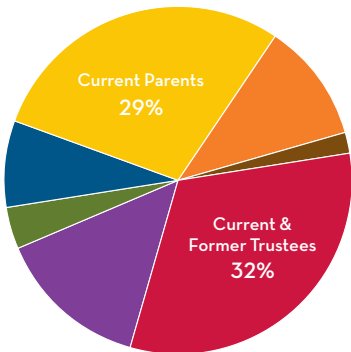

Through the trials and uncertainties of the COVID-19 pandemic, we demonstrated our resilience and adaptability. However, we learned that summer that due to the increase in construction costs, the goal of our campaign would need to increase as well. In October 2021, the Trustees Council voted to increase the Room to Move campaign goal to \$7,000,000.

While the increase seemed daunting at the time, the school community stood firmly with us every step of the way. As we progressed through the campaign, your dedication became evident in the remarkable figures—a staggering \$7,127,037 raised from 403 donors, surpassing our initial goal by over \$127,000. With immense pride, we announce that 75% of last year's current parents and 80% of last year's faculty actively participated in this transformative effort. Furthermore, 100% of our



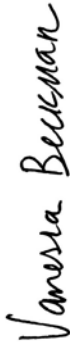
Trustees Council members rallied behind the cause, along with 63 alumni who gave, many for the first time, leaving an indelible mark on our school.

The Washington Waldorf School is thrilled to share that the Room to Move campaign to build a gymnasium on our school's campus exceeded its \$7 million fundraising goal! Altogether, 403 donors came together to raise a total of \$7,127,037! Every dollar raised as a part of this campaign has contributed to the project. Funds raised beyond the \$7 million goal will be used by the school to replenish its reserve funds. Prior to the Room to Move campaign, a portion of the school's reserve funds were used for planning, permitting, and consulting, as well as early architectural and engineering fees.

We thank every donor and volunteer who contributed their resources and time towards making the Room to Move campaign and the John and Mary Brauer Gym possible. We especially thank our lead donor and alum parent, Brad Clark, for his transformative \$3.5 million challenge gift towards this initiative. His investment has inspired the Washington Waldorf School community to match his generosity, dollar for dollar, to reach a total goal of \$7 million dollars to finance the Gym.

We also extend our gratitude to our Campaign Co-Chairs, Vanessa and John Beckman and Maria Monteverde-Jackson and Jon Jackson. They worked tirelessly throughout this campaign, hosted many events, met individually with other families, and inspired our community to give at its highest capacity.

We achieved 100% participation from the Trustees Council, 80% support from faculty and staff, and 3 out of 4 parents supported the school during this time. Many donors increased their giving over prior years, and multiple families made their largest commitments ever to make this vision a reality, including 35 gifts of \$25,000 or more. In addition, 63 alums stepped forward to support this effort, many of them giving to our school for the first time.

Every donor who contributed to this campaign will be honored on a plaque in the new Gym. It took our entire community to make this endeavor possible, and this visual representation of each donor's participation will not only recognize and honor every gift, it will also inspire future generations of WWS families.

At Mr. Clark's request, the Gym will be named after two longtime faculty members, alum parents, and grandparents of the school, John and Mary Brauer. The John and Mary Brauer Gym opened in time for the 2023/2024 school year, and now serves as an athletic facility, additional classroom space, and a community space. We have already held festivals in the Gym, students regularly participate in movement classes, and we're planning how to use the extra space during our annual Fall Bazaar. We will celebrate the first basketball game and host a plaque dedication on December 1, 2023. We hope you can attend. **There is truly more Room to Move!**

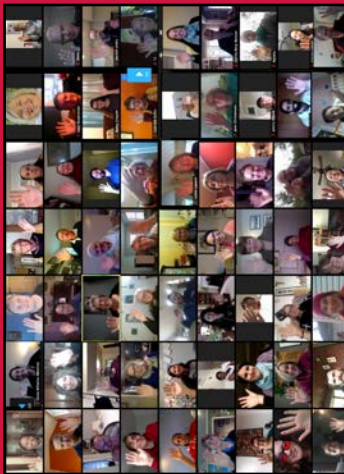
